A BASE-CAMP TO DISCOVERY

Visitors have come to know Calgary for our Rocky Mountain backdrop and annual Calgary Stampede. In addition to the snow crested mountains and cowboy charm, the region has a 100-year history of dinosaur and fossil exploration. Fossil discovery sites like Drumheller, the Dinosaur Capital of the World and the Royal Tyrrell Museum, home to one of the world's largest display of dinosaurs, sit just outside the city.

An exciting basecamp to pre-and-post conference exploration for any dino-loving delegate, the Calgary TELUS Convention Centre (CTCC) can host 4,000 people. In August, Calgary hosted the Society of Vertebrate Paleontology's (SVP) Annual Meeting. With hundreds of new fossil discoveries reported to the Royal Tyrrell Museum each year, Calgary's backyard was a bountiful playground for the 1,000 vertebrate enthusiasts who embarked on the city.

The Calgary TELUS Convention Centre (CTCC) served as SVP's basecamp to discovery. It gave attendees from around the globe a place to convene and share their innovative research. Main conference sessions ran at the Centre, preluded by seven field trips to some of the world's richest fossil beds.

DRUMHELLER & THE BADLANDS

Departing from Calgary east into the endless prairies, the fertile land suddenly drops away into strange and stark moonscapes— The Badlands. View the impressive Horseshoe Canyon and learn about the geology, history, and native plants and animals at the Interpretive Centre. End your field trip in the town of Drumheller, the Dinosaur Capital of the World, and a visit to the Royal Tyrrell Museum of Paleontology.
